

Stay Safe While Riding

- Ride in the first train car.

- Disrupt harassment by asking someone else on the train what time it is.

- Don't freeze, it is ok to walk away and move to another train car.

- Note the train car number listed above the end train door in case you report the person.

Helping others through bystander intervention

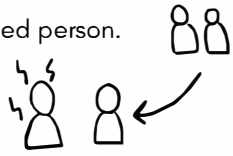
Assess the **situation**.



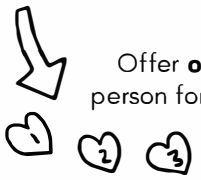
Ask another bystander to **support** you.



Approach the targeted person. **Ignore** the attacker.



Offer **options** to the targeted person for how you can **support** them.

Not One More Girl

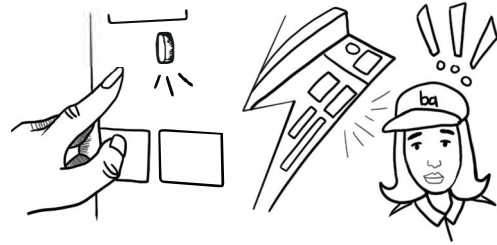
Not One More Girl is a community-driven initiative centering girls and gender expansive youth to reimagine safety for riders on BART.

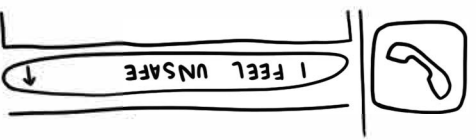
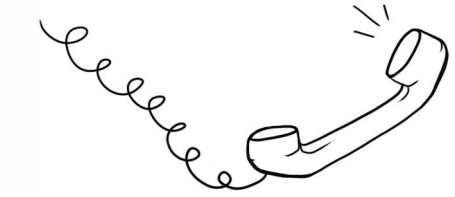

Getting Help On Bart

Use the train intercom bottom located at the end doors on old cars and side doors on new cars to speak to the train operator.



Use the white phones or white intercom call box on each platform to connect to a station agent.

Use the free BART Watch app to send a private message to police dispatch.
