Item 2 Public Comments

a. Report of burglaries at 2 separate E-Lockers using similar technique. Vendor is aware of situation and is working on addressing method used to break into the lockers. .

Item 4 BBATF recommendations for BART access hierarchy

- A. Shirley Johnson presented a letter to the BART Board supporting the updated BART access hierarchy (pedestrian, bicycle, public transit, private vehicles).
- B. Committee suggested minor changes
- C. Letter was approved. Chair of BBATF (Dave Favello) will sign for the BBATF and send to BART Board.

Item 5 2015 Station Profile Survey

Steve presented preliminary data from extensive Station Profile Survey (app. 50,000 people were surveyed covering all stations at various times of the day).

- A. Final report will be out in June.
- B. Results presented focused on % of people who accessed the station by bicycle, and how many parked their bicycle at the station.
- C. Stations where more than 10% of people accessed station by bicycle: Lake Merritt, 19th St., Macarthur, West Oakland, North Berkeley, Ashby, Fruitvale, and 16th St.
- D. % who parked bicycle at station varies widely (over 50% at 19th Street and El Cerrito Plaza to 6% at 24th St.). Average was 25% of bikes
 - a. In 2008 40% of bicycles parked at station
 - b. Significant portion of drop in % parking at station is most likely due to new bikes on BART rules, allowing more bikes on BART during commute times.
 - c. Raises question about goal of 60% of bikes will need parking at station.

Item 6 Bikes on Escalators, review of other agencies policies

A. Most other transit agencies that Steve contacted do not allow bicycles on escalators. Exception: Montreal.

B. Need better safety data if want to try and change BART policy.

- 1. West Oakland Locker Plaza
 - a. Added 84 e-Lockers and new bike racks for 50 additional bicycles
- 2. Pleasant Hill Bike Station
 - a. Have authority to sign lease
 - b. 2200 square feet. Room for 280 bicycles
 - c. Retail Space (and when bike station will be staffed): 7am 11am.
- 3. Concord and Lafayette Bike Station
 - a. Unstaffed: Room for about 130 bicycles
 - b. Have money for design and engineering.
- 4. Macarthur
 - a. Plans have been sent out.
- 5. Downtown Berkeley
 - a. City of Berkeley is providing space in Center St. parking garage and BART will move their bike station to garage.
 - b. Room for 300 bikes
 - c. Anticipated opening: June 2017
- 6. Walnut Creek Bike Pavilion
 - a. Under trackway behind police substation
 - b. 96 e-Lockers and bike racks for 60 bicycles.
- 7. Bikeep high security bike rack
 - a. www.bikeep.com
 - b. Bike racks with built in lock and bars.
 - c. Can lock frame and both wheels
 - d. Locking can be controlled by Clipper Card
 - e. BART is buying 20 for a demonstration project.
